EDIBLE LANDSCAPING PLANTS FOR BELMONT BLUEBERRIES AND LINGONBERRIES

ORDER FROM JANUARY 12 THROUGH JANUARY 31ST
PICKUP LATE APRIL IN BELMONT

Homeowners often seek plants that are attractive, interesting, unusual and easy to care for that also can fit into their landscape. Blueberry and lingonberry bushes both fit these requirements and produce edible fruit also.

The Belmont Farmers' Market Committee is organizing a group purchase of blueberry and lingonberry plants. We have selected 6 blueberry varieties and 3 lingonberry varieties to choose from. It will be fun and interesting to plant these berries in our gardens and compare notes on the different varieties.

Both blueberries and lingonberries have very similar requirements, preferring acidic soil. If you have rhododendrons or azaleas in your landscaping then you have the right conditions. If not, it is easy to create conditions for these plants to thrive in a sunny to lightly shaded area.

The taller blueberries will work well as foundation plantings or hedges and the lower growing lingonberries make an excellent ground cover that remains green all year. The delicious fruit that the plants produce is an added bonus for your family or wildlife.

PLANT VARIETIES

Blueberry Aurora late season mature height 5-6 feet
Aurora is a new variety that ripens very late thus extending the blueberry season.

Blueberry Bluecrop mid season mature height 5-6 feet
Bluecrop grows in midseason into an upright bush and to the point of overbearing. It produces medium to large, light-blue fruit of good quality. The fruit is firm, resistant to cracking and has a good flavor. This cultivar is hardier and more drought resistant than most.

Blueberry Draper early-mid season mature height 6-7 feet
Newer variety similar to bluecrop. Ripens slightly ahead of bluecrop though.

Blueberry Duke early season mature height 4-6 feet
Berry is very firm and retains its fresh quality longer than most other varieties. Blooms late but ripens early, protecting blossoms from late frosts. Heavy, consistent producer. Upright growth but branches will droop to the ground when laden with fruit. Yellow-orange foliage in the fall. Medium to large light blue berries.

Blueberry Chippawa mid season mature height 3 feet
A very hardy hybrid blueberry with a more compact habit and good fall color, produces huge crops of large, sweet light blue fruit in mid summer

Blueberry Little Giant mid season mature height 3-4 feet
The fruits are small, 1000 berries per pound and very flavorful. Yields are consistently high

Lingonberry Regal mature height 8-15 inches
Plants are vigorous and adapt well to transplanting. Berry size is medium to large. Berry quality is good and firm with good flavor. Developed by Eldon Stang at the Univ of Wisconsin from seed collected in Finland. Regal was selected for its superior fruit size and precocious bearing.

Lingonberry Red Pearl mature height 12-18 inches
Plant is spreading and very vigorous and production is high: 1 to 1-1/2 pounds per
Plant. Berry size is medium to large. Flavor is comparable to other Lingonberries
with a sweet-acid flavor.

All lingonberry plants in 4 inch container
Lingonberry price \$6 each,
\$5 each in quantities of 4 or more.
\$4 each in quantities of 12 or more. Lingonberry varieties may be mixed for quantity
price.
